GREAT BRITAIN TEAM WINS IN ROME



Team Great Britain produced a superb back-to-back double in the Furusiyya FEI Nations Cup™ Jumping 2015 Europe Division 1 League when following up their success at La Baule, France a week ago with another extraordinary victory at Piazza di Siena in Rome, Italy today. It was another nail-biting competition that came down to a fierce battle with the reigning Furusiyya champions from The Netherlands this time around. And, not for the first time in his long and legendary career, the result was sealed by the master craftsman John Whitaker.

It was his younger brother, 55-year-old Michael, who clinched it for his side at the French fixture seven days ago, but today his single time fault could have cost his country dearly. Because if John, who turns 60 in August, left a fence on the floor second time out, then all the glory would go to the Dutch. But instead he produced one of four double-clear rounds to ensure pole position and a standing ovation for his team from the enthusiastic Italian crowd.

Sweden lined up third behind The Netherlands while Spain, Switzerland, Italy, Qatar and Belgium filled the remaining places. It was a tough day for the host nation who had high hopes of repeating the success they enjoyed at the opening Europe Division 1 leg in Lummen, Belgium. But, other than a foot-perfect first round from Giulia Martinengo Marquet, who got a late call-up with Fixdesign Funke van't Heike, clears proved elusive for the home side.

Another hero of the day today was master Italian course-designer Uliano Vezzani whose judgement and skill was tested to the limit by appalling weather conditions that seriously affected the arena surface. Thunderous rain, that fell for over an hour before the competition began, made the going deep and sloppy, and he took the decision to lower rails, reduce spreads and take over a metre off the stretch of the open water in order to ensure the welfare of horses was not compromised in any way. Yet he still produced an afternoon of intense competition that went right down to the wire.

SWITZERLAND'S RUTSCHI AND ITALY'S PREVITALI TAKE THE EARLY HONOURS ON FRIDAY



With great excitement in the air ahead of the Furusiyya FEI Nations Cup™ presented by Longines, Switzerland's Niklaus Rutschi and Italy's Roberto Previtali got Friday's action off to a great start with wins in the two early Speed competitions.

From the 41 starters in the 1.45m class, only seven managed to stay inside the time-allowed of 76 seconds, and Rutschi was quickest through the finish with 11-year-old chestnut gelding Earl Pery's Caro CH. It was a convincing victory for the 49-year-old rider who had well over a second of an advantage over Italian runner-up Giovanni Lucchetti partnering the

nine-year-old gelding, Brian, while British legend, John Whitaker, slotted into third with the 10-year-old mare Ornellaiai ahead of reigning European champion Roger Yves Bost from France in fourth with Sangria du Coty. Rutschi very nearly made it a double when posting a fast time of 73.35 seconds in the 1.50 Table C class with the nine-year-old mare St Gracieue Ardente, but Previtali raced home a full second quicker to take top spot with the 12-year-old Oldenburg mare Ambra 83.

Belgium's Pieter Devos lined up third of the 38 starters here with Equipharma Dax v Dibdijjhoeve while Italy's Luca de Lorenzo, who has been prominent in every competition so far this week, was fourth with Gangster de Longchamps. Mares have also been stealing a lot of the prizes at Piazza di Siena this week, and it was another 10-year-old, Rosana du Park ridden by 2008 Olympic champion Eric Lamaze from Canada, who claimed fourth place here.
